

UNICEF UNVEILS LATEST INNOVATION TO IMPROVE EDUCATION IN EMERGENCIES

UNICEF today announced the launch of a new generation of innovative multi-purpose tents which will provide a wide range of humanitarian support for children affected by conflict and disasters around the world. The new and improved High Performance Tents include multiple add-on features aimed at meeting the needs of children in emergencies worldwide and are the result of a two-year with co-creation process industry partners.Humanitarian multipurpose tents offer safe spaces for children fleeing from conflict or natural disaster. They can be used as schools, health clinics, nutrition facilities, distribution points and child-friendly spaces Between 2013 and 2018, UNICEF procured on average 4,650 multipurpose tents per year at an annual average total cost of US\$6.6 million. 




UAE MAKES \$15M PLEDGE TO IMPROVE SUDAN EDUCATION SYSTEM

The UAE has announced AED55 million (\$15 million) for school supplies that will support 400,000 students in Sudan.The monetary aid, provided by Abu Dhabi Fund for Development (ADFD) covers educational necessities, including classroom equipment, state news agency WAM reported.ADFD, in cooperation with the Sudanese government, supervised the delivery of the first shipment of school supplies that covers the needs of 10,000 students, it added. The school supplies support package falls within the framework of the AED11 billion (\$3 billion) Saudi Arabia-UAE joint aid package aimed at supporting Sudan's economic and financial stability.As part of the package, Saudi Arabia and the UAE deposited a financial allocation of \$500 million into the Central Bank of Sudan earlier this year to strengthen its financial position. The UAE and Saudi Arabia have also dispatched 540,000 tonnes of wheat worth \$150 million to enhance food security in Sudan over a three-month period.. Source: Arabian Business
