EWF 2020 HIGHLIGHTS "CRISIS" IN EDUCATION

Speakers at the Education World Forum 2020 in London discussed a "crisis in education", airing concerns that Sustainable Development Goal 4 – which includes universal primary and secondary schooling and universal literacy for children among its aims. According to Saavedra, in lower and middle-income countries 53% of 10-year-olds cannot read and understand a simple story. This rises to an estimated 90% in Sub-Saharan Africa. The importance of pre-primary education was also highlighted, particularly with regards to how it can promote continuing education as children grow up.Developments in edtech were praised for improving education access for disabled children, though there appeared to remain some questions about how it can be best used in disadvantaged areas."I do think the glass is half full. If we look back in the 1950s, some 50% of primary school children were out of school," said Robert Jenkins, chief of education at UNICEF. **Source: The Pie News**


