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HOW SOCIAL MEDIA INFLUENCERS ARE SHAPING UNIVERSITIES

YouTube is becoming an increasingly important platform for universities.Videos posted by the 20 universities with the highest-viewed content on the site were seen 58.9m times. Being a growing space, university-related content posted by influencers has seen views increase by 20% in the last year alone.It's not just students who are producing influential education content on YouTube – graduates and academics are too. With funny videos taking a sideways look at science get millions of views, YouTube has heavily promoted its educational content, and last year announced £15m worth of investment in grants for creators providing high-quality output. Education sector got the maximum funds of Rs 15,742 crore from the CSR expenditure made by corporates since 2014-15, while such contribution towards armed forces and war widows was just above Rs 81 crore, Parliament was informed on Monday. Under the Companies Act, certain classes of profitable companies are required to shell out at least 2 per cent of their threeyear annual average net profit towards corporate social responsibility (CSR) activities in a particular financial year and the require. The CSR activities taken up by the companies relate to various sectors including education, healthcare, sanitation, environmental sustainability, poverty alleviation and skill development. 35 EUROPEAN UNIVERSITIES TO TAKE PART IN HIGHER EDUCATION FAIR



The UAE leader also said that success would not be measured in economic growth, although very important, but by the quality of life and the added value offered.Sheikh Khalifa also highlighted the achievements of UAE astronaut Hazza Al Mansoori, the first Emirati to visit the International Space Station.
